Children may bring caps/hats to school for play times when it is hot and sunny – you must ensure that these are named if we are going to be able to support you in retrieving any lost property.

# Reading Records at CAW



I look forward to seeing the children's reading records in the mornings as I visit each classroom.




# How does the Reading Raffle work?

# School Drop Off and Collection Hatchlings (Nursery) 2021/22

- Paddock Entrance will open to Hatchlings at 08:40 and close at 08:50
- Families who arrive at school after 08:50 will need to 'buzz' their gate to be welcomed by a member of staff and will be marked as late.
- Siblings in Years 1 6 can be dropped off at either the Canteen Gate or the Main Gate from 8:30 8:45



# School Drop Off and Collection Robins (Reception) 2021/22

- Orchard Gate (see map below) will open to Robins at 08:30 and close at 08:45 (please note that Robins will be welcomed from 08:30 but siblings in Hatchlings can also use this entrance but will be welcomed from 08:40 8:45)
- Families who arrive at school after 08:45 will need to 'buzz' their gate to be welcomed by a member of staff and will be marked as late.
- Siblings in Years 1 6 can be dropped off at the Main Gate or the Canteen Gate from 8:30 8:45



# Year 1 – 6 Drop Off 2021-22
