Dear Parents/Carers

We are currently seeking nominations for a parent volunteer to join our Local Academy Board (LAB). The LAB is responsible for the governance of the school at a local level. This is similar to a governing body in a local authority maintained school but operates slightly differently because we are part of the Aurora Academies Trust.

What is the LAB?

The purpose of the LAB at City Academy Whitehawk (CAW) is to ensure that all children at the school access the best quality educational experiences leading to high levels of achievement and aspiration..

Who is on the LAB?

Our LAB potentially has 10 members:

Chair (appointed by Aurora)

Headteacher (ex officio)

1 staff member(elected by staff)

2 parent members (elected by parents)

Up to 5 community members (appointed by the LAB following an application process)

How many meetings will there be?

We meet 6 times per year either in person or, at the moment, online. Minutes of the meetings are available online. We also visit the school at other times, meet with the children and staff and undertake a range of monitoring activities in agreement with school.

What does a LAB member do?

LAB members contribute to the strategic direction of the schoo and work closely with senior leaders, both supporting and challenging as appropriate. As a parent LAB member you will be responsible for listening to the school community and being an ambassador for the school locally. It is our job to ensure that the school's senior leadership secure the best possible outcomes for all the children in the school.

What skills does a LAB member need?

You don't need experience of being a LAB member or school governor. We are looking for someone with a passion for the school and the ability to act as a "Critical Friend" to the school's Senior Leadership Team. This means being supportive of the school but also challenging the school t where, and when, appropriate.

How do I apply?

If you are interested in nominating yourself for the role of Parent LAB Member please read the <u>role description</u> and follow <u>this link</u> to complete a nomination form. Alternatively you may contact the office for a hard copy. The closing date is 8 October 2021. All parents and carers of pupils in the school or nursery are eligible to stand for election.

Reading Records at CAW


One huge learning point for us as a school during our closures last year was how keen many families are to support their children with their learning. This is most important in reading! Practice really does make perfect and once you've mastered it, there is so much to explore and enjoy.

All school subjects are equally important but we know it to be true that Reading is the first amongst those equals. Children who read well and read for pleasure go on to be significantly more successful.

You will have received a letter from Miss. Scozzafava earlier this week about our new Reading Records. This is a brand new wholeschool venture for us at CAW, promoting the amazing reading so many of you do at home; hopefully this will enable and encourage you to do it even more often and earn some amazing reading prizes whilst doing so. We have an amazingly well stocked library here at school and fantastic Read Write Inc. books to support your child in learning to read. Your child should be bringing books their book to and from school daily – please encourage them to practise at home and celebrate their progress. A book bag or back pack is a great way to help your child stay organised with this.

I look forward to seeing the children's reading records in the mornings as I visit each classroom.



How does the Reading Raffle work?

- For every 5 dates of reading (typically 1 page) you will earn a reading raffle ticket, ideally this would be 5 reads in a week.
- You can earn 1 ticket each day you read.
- Your teacher will give you a special Reading Raffle Ticket.
- You get to choose which book you would like the chance to win!
- In the penultimate week of term, I will draw the tickets and each winner will receive their books in assembly!

CAW Fluency Badge

Please can you join us in helping your children to learn their number bonds to ten (eg. 4 + 6 = 10) and start to learn all single digit addition facts (eg. 5 + 7 = 12). Knowing these facts helps children to be much more successful in all other areas of maths.

Children sit a national times tables assessment at the end of Year 4, by which time they should know all of their times tables facts. Please study these at home – we'll be teaching them at school too. I look forward to organising maths workshops for parents when restrictions are lifted. Children in Key Stage 2 can be tested by Mr. McAdam to win their Fluency Badge!

CAW Addition Facts

Our aim is for children to be able to recall all single digit addition facts as quickly as they can tell you their name.

They should also be able to recall their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Do you have what it takes to be a CAW Ambassador?

Thank you so much for all of the amazing application letters I have received. I have responded to each and every letter and have invited applicants to prepare a speech to present to Years 5 and 6 on Tuesday morning. After this, we will hold an election! Perhaps this is something you could be preparing for at home. I find it really useful to practise the things I have to say aloud to a big audience — it helps me to feel confident. Could this work for you too? Feet shoulder width apart, hands by your sides (like you're carrying shopping bags), chin up and eyes facing forward. Why not record yourself rehearsing your speech and making it better each time?

Bottles and 'Bits'

Please make sure your children bring their named water bottle to and from school each day. We must remind you, we struggle to provide children with cups as these cannot be shared and are ecologically and economically a worse option than each child having their own clean bottle. Please help us to keep your children hydrated by sending them to school with a named bottle every day.

Children may bring caps/hats to school for play times when it is hot and sunny – you must ensure that these are named if we are going to be able to support you in retrieving any lost property.

Please ensure that children bring a named coat (preferably with a hood) to school with them.

School Uniform
