We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Arbor App

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday



Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
 Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.



We're very excited to raise the profile of Rare Disease Day and raise some money for this special cause that is so close to the hearts of so many members of the Whitehawk community. With lovely Imogen and her family at the front of our minds, we're hoping you'll join us in wearing jeans and making a donation to the David Ashwell Foundation on Monday 28th February.

Please ensure that children are wearing their school tee shirts and school jumpers. They can wear jeans/denim on their bottom half and appropriate footwear. We'll gratefully accept a donation on the gate on Monday morning if you're in a position to make one.

From Thursday 24th February


You will not be legally required to self-isolate if you test positive for COVID-19. You should stay at home if you can and avoid contact with other people. It is good public health practice to **stay at home if you are unwell** with covid or any other respiratory illness. Always notify us at school of a positive test result so that we can advise you.

You will not have to take daily tests or be legally required to self-isolate following contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.

Until 31st March

If you have any COVID-19 **symptoms** you should avoid contact with others and order a PCR test. If you test positive, stay at home and avoid contact with other people.

Each winning class received learning tickets and a bundle of books for the classroom. Library cards will be handed to all children who submitted a card on 3rd March.





























LATES...

Please aim for children to be in school at 8.30am and no later than 8.45am.



We will all be contributing to different art projects throughout the day that will go on display in Whitehawk Library and at CAW!




Whitehawk Library After School Event





Staying Healthy

Nut Allergy

We have children in school with severe Nut Allergies, therefore, please can we remind you that **no** food containing nuts should be brought into school. This includes but is not limited to Nutella, Peanut Butter, Pesto, Bread or Cereal/Chocolate Bars. Please take care when sending your child into school with food by checking the ingredients.

Sickness and Diarrhoea

If you child has been sick or has diarrhoea, please do not send them to school until 48 hours after their last bout. This is crucial in supporting us in reducing the risk of spreading viruses and keeping the school community as healthy as possible.

Water Bottles

Please make sure your children bring a named water bottle to and from school each day. We must remind you, we struggle to provide children with cups as these cannot be shared and are ecologically and economically a worse option than each child having their own clean bottle. Please help us to keep your children hydrated by sending them to school with a named bottle every day.

Stikins Name Labels

As we all know, lost property is a problem in all schools and I am sure we are all familiar with our child, at some point, coming home from school with a missing item. As parents, we are aware that time is precious, which is why we think these labels are such a great idea; they simply stick onto the wash-care label of clothing. They can even be used in shoes! Naming of clothing is a school requirement and we are hoping that with this opportunity we can start to eliminate some of parents' frustrations that surround these issues.

Please Cut Grapes

Grapes **should always be cut lengthwise** so they can pass more easily through smaller throats. Avoid slicing widthwise because they'll still be big enough to choke on. You can either slice them downwards in half or you might want to cut them lengthwise again into quarters.
