We have some important changes to school organisation next week so please make sure you have read every page of this letter before coming on to site on Monday morning.

Changes To School Entrances

Mrs. Dolan, Mr. Hill and I are excited to announce that **next week** our Trim Trail play equipment is being removed and replaced with brand new play apparatus. This means the Hatchlings will have a new Trim Trail and our upper playground Trim Trail will be replaced for all other year groups to use in the drier months. We can't wait!

We will have a construction team on site for the week so please note:


- There will be no access to the office through the Paddock gate or North entrance.
- Hatchlings will be dropped off and collected through the Orchard gate (see below) and via the Reception veranda.
- Years 1-6 can still be dropped off and collected using the canteen gate but please keep your children safe around the vehicles and skips that will be parked in the canteen car park.
- All members of staff have received a Risk Assessment that will be in effect for the duration of the works.
- Every member of the construction team has a DBS and is working safely inside Covid regulations.

These works are only scheduled to last a week and we plan to return to normal access and egress arrangements from January 17th. I look forward to sending you photos in my next letter!

674 tickets were entered into last term's raffle!


That's 3,370 reads at home!


This is a 930 read increase on Reading Raffle I!

The top ticket earning classes were: Barn Owls (II4), Herons (77) and Magpies (67)




The new Reading Raffle Prizes have been announced in class this week and the tickets are already mounting up nicely!



Last, browse the selection and make your pick! Many are available in Brighton and Hove Libraries and we may even have them in school – ask your teacher!







Book-vent ready for borrowing!

CAW Fluency Badge

Mr. McAdam has a rapidly growing number of children earning their number fact FLUENCY BADGE. Well done, guys.

Please can you join us in helping your children to learn their number bonds to ten (eg. 4 + 6 = 10) and start to learn all single digit addition facts (eg. 5 + 7 = 12)? Knowing these facts helps children to be much more successful in all other areas of maths.

Children sit a national times tables assessment at the end of Year 4, by which time they should know all of their times tables facts. Please study these at home – we'll be teaching them at school too. I look forward to organising maths workshops for parents when restrictions are lifted. Children in Key Stage 2 can be tested by Mr. McAdam to win their Fluency Badge!

They should also be able to recall their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
