The Provision of Assemblies

To meet the National Curriculum stipulation of a daily act of collective worship or assembly, these are provided as weekly year group assemblies including celebration and three times weekly, as class assemblies at the end of the learning day. Class assemblies are centrally planned. British Values form a significant part of the assembly structure, along with Growth Mindset and a strong commitment to the expansion of the cultural capital of all children.

The National Curriculum states that schools should promote pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development; By focussing on British Values in a way that is relevant to children; they will learn their rights and responsibilities and will develop an inclusive outlook that celebrates difference, individuality, the rule of law and how it protects and guide. By understanding that democracy provides choice and voice and that other parts of the world run under different rules, the children will grow knowing how to exercise their own voice and to respect the voice of others. As agents of social change, schools, through assembly and day to day education and interaction accounts for a significant provision in language development, cultural, historical, artistic, philosophical and musical knowledge bank. By providing cultural capital within assemblies on a weekly basis, we seek for children to be confident, aspirational, well-informed, inquisitive life-long learners.



CAW Ethos Assemblies

These are held on a Monday morning by Head Teacher Thomas McMorrin in order gather as a school community and to set the CAW ethos goal for the week. Our school Growth set based ethos spells CAREER: Collaboration; Aspiration; Resilience, Effort, Excellence and Respect. The assembly discusses the ethos, making it crystal clear how every child can achieve one of the 4 certificates available to each class. Teachers promote the ethos for the week and present certificates in the assembly on the following Monday.
