CAW Fluency Badge

Children sit a national times tables assessment at the end of Year 4, by which time they should know all of their times tables facts. Please study these at home – we'll be teaching them at school too. **Children in Key Stage 2 can be quizzed by Mr. McAdam to win their Fluency Badge!**

If you earned a badge last year, please can you keep proudly wearing it! If you need a new badge – you will need to be quizzed again!




Year 1-6 Home Time 2022/23
