
Dear City Academy Whitehawk Families,



Born in Frankfurt, Germany in 1929 (nearly 100 years ago), Anne Frank was a Jewish girl who was forced into hiding to avoid the Nazi Holocaust. This was a plan by the Nazis to send all Jewish people to Concentration Camps where they would be forced to work and then killed. Anne wrote an incredible diary while she was hiding in a secret attic in a house in Amsterdam in the Netherlands. Sadly, Anne's family were found and she was sent to a Concentration Camp, where she died at the age of 15.
