Early Years — Bear Breakfast





Strike Action in Spring 2

The National Education Union (NEU) has declared strike action. These strikes due to take place on:

• Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March 2023.

These strikes are happening because of a national dispute between the Unions and the Government over how schools are funded and teachers' pay and conditions.

Due to the likely disruption to be caused around staffing arrangements, it is possible that City Academy Whitehawk will be closed to all pupils on 15th and 16th March. I will communicate this decision as soon as possible, hopefully no later than Wednesday 8th March. I am communicating this possibility now to allow families as much time as possible to make childcare arrangements.

We are committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our pupils. For this to be achieved, we require a minimum number of trained colleagues to be on site and I do not yet know if this can be guaranteed on Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March.

I fully understand that this situation may be frustrating for you as families. I recognise the impact that this is likely to have on our families and I regret the disruption that will be caused. We are planning the term meticulously to ensure that we can make the most of every moment at school.


As a school, we raised a whopping £208.35, which will go to supporting

We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Arbor App

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday


Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
 Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are Primary Guardians of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.



So far 83% of our parents/carers have signed up to use the App.

You should have received the activation email, if you are having any problems activating the App please contact the school office.

We are aiming to use this Portal as our main Communication channel, this will help reduce the amount of paper used in school.

Hi Everyone,

I just wanted to remind you all about our amazing Oxford Owl eBook library. There are so many books to choose from and take quizzes on. This can be recorded in your child's Reading record.

Login information is accessible on the school's website. Click Pupils / Reading / Oxford Owl

After half term, you might notice some additions to your child's Reading folder. A slip like this will tell you how frequently to expect a new story book.

A slip like this will remind you to return your child's folder, or request a new one to be made if it is lost. It will also tell you what book your child is currently reading, so you can access it online.


We are looking at lots of ways to improve access to the school for



Florence Nightingale (1820-1910)

The Mother of Modern Nursing

Florence Nightingale worked tirelessly as nurse during the Crimean War, bringing indefatigable compassion to countless wounded soldiers. Her hard work led to huge changes being made in health care across the world, but she also campaigned for social reform (to make laws fairer), as well as pioneering the use of graphs and statistics.

Safer Sleep in Winter



Keeping your baby safe when the weather gets cold

The Lullaby Trust has issued information around safe sleep for babies during the winter in response to rising energy costs. Please see below:

The recommended room temperature is 16-20 degrees, this may be difficult to maintain in the colder months. It can be tempting to wrap your baby up to keep them warm, however we know that overheating a baby increases the chances of SIDS (also known as cot death). Research shows babies are better to be cooler than too hot.
