Dear City Academy Whitehawk Families,

Strike Action – Tuesday 2nd May 2023

The National Education Union (NEU) has declared further strike action. The remaining strike is due to take place on Tuesday 2nd May 2023. This strike is happening because of an ongoing national dispute between the Unions and the Government over how schools are funded and teachers' pay and conditions.

I can confirm that due to the disruption to be caused to staffing arrangements, City Academy Whitehawk will be closed to all pupils on Tuesday 2nd May 2023. As with the previous strike closures, I assure you that this decision has not been made lightly. I communicated this decision to you on April 20th to allow families as much time as possible to make childcare arrangements for closure.

We are committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our pupils. For this to be achieved, we require a minimum number of trained colleagues to be on site and this cannot be guaranteed on these days. In the highly unlikely event that predicted staffing numbers change, I will notify families or groups of families as soon as possible.

I fully understand that this situation might be frustrating for families but we recognise and respect the rights of our staff to take part in industrial action. I recognise the impact that this is likely to have on the community and I regret the disruption that will be caused over the next fortnight. We have planned carefully and ambitiously to make sure that we make the most of every minute of every day that we are at school.

As I said in my letter, I am sincerely grateful for the support, flexibility and kindness you demonstrated during the periods of school closure last term.



Attendance at City Academy

Last Wednesday saw our BEST EVER DAY for whole school attendance with every child at school for **Hatchlings, Goldfinches, Greenfinches, Magpies, Kestrels and Barn Owls** classes. Well done!

Our overall attendance rates are still lower than other schools across the city, so PLEASE do not let your child miss school unless the absence is ABSOLUTELY UNAVOIDABLE...

We are continuing our focus on UNEXPLAINED ABSENCES this term. Mrs Storey will be in contact with individual families about this as needed.

Finally, we have had a high number of requests for term time holidays already term. Please remember that we cannot authorise these and families should expect to receive fines from the Local Authority

You can claim it if you receive Universal Credit and

- you are more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under 4
- your family's monthly 'take-home pay for this period' is £408 or less from employment

You can also claim it if you get Child Tax Credit, if:

- you have at least one child under 4 years old
- your family's annual income is £16,190 or less
 - you do not get Working Tax Credit

We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Arbor App

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday


Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
 Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are Primary Guardians of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.



So far 82% of our parents/carers have signed up to use the App.

You should have received the activation email, if you are having any problems activating the App please contact the school office.

We are aiming to use this Portal as our main Communication channel, this will help reduce the amount of paper used in school.

Summer Term Clubs

Did you know that in our Autumn Parent Survey, 90% of families reported that they agreed / strongly agreed that their child had 'lots of opportunities to take part in school clubs and activities'? We were very pleased with this feedback.

We look forward to publishing our Summer offer on Wednesday 19th April, ready for an April 24th start.

Our 'first come, first served' ParentPay sign up process will open at 18:00 on Wednesday 19th April. With the exception of karate, we are very proud of our commitment to funding all after school clubs for children.


