We opened our **excellent** new library 'City Academy Wilderness' on Monday with a ribbon cutting ceremony and a special viewing from authors Sue Hendra (Supertato!), Steve McCarthy (The Wilderness!) and representatives from each class. Huge thanks to the parent team who have put so much energy, creativity and passion into this project. 





#### Spike Milligan Irish comedian and writer

Spike Milligan was a very funny and talented comedian, writer, and actor. He was born on April 16, 1918, in India. Spike was famous for his unique sense of humour and silly jokes. He created and starred in a popular comedy show called 'The Goon Show' on the radio in the 1950s. Children and adults loved listening to his funny stories and characters. As well as being a comedian, Spike fought in World War II. He suffered from depression and wrote about how to deal with this so that he could help others. Spike's funny and clever jokes are still enjoyed by many people today, even though he passed away on February 27, 2002.
