












# Year 6 Sea Swimming



Here are some fun ways to become a more fluent reader.






Point to sounds on the chart to see how many your child can read in 1 minute. Can they beat their personal best?







- you are more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under 4
- your family's monthly 'take-home pay for this period' is £408 or less from employment

You can also claim it if you get Child Tax Credit, if:

- you have at least one child under 4 years old
- your family's annual income is £16,190 or less
  - you do not get Working Tax Credit
