We would love the children to wear their house team colours to their Sports Day if they would like to. If they do not want to wear their house colours, they can wear their normal PE kits on this day.






We are 104 tickets away from beating our whole school, whole year personal best! We will easily achieve this so....



# How can children have an impact on Climate Change?



#### **Architect and designer**

Antoni Gaudí, born on 25<sup>th</sup> June 1852, was a famous Spanish architect known for his unique and colourful buildings. He designed many beautiful structures in Barcelona, Spain, using bright tiles, twisted iron, and nature-inspired shapes. His most famous work is the Sagrada Família, a giant church that looks like a fairytale castle and is still being built even today! Gaudi's creative designs make him one of the most imaginative architects in history.

Art Nouveau is the movement that influenced Gaudi the most, stimulating him to experiment with new materials and new shapes, thereby helping him to give up imitating historical styles and find his own way.

Born in New Jersey, USA in 1935, Sylvia Earle is a world-famous oceanographer (someone who studies the seas, and the creatures that live in them). She has authored over 150 publications, and continues to campaign passionately for our seas and environment at the age of 88.


