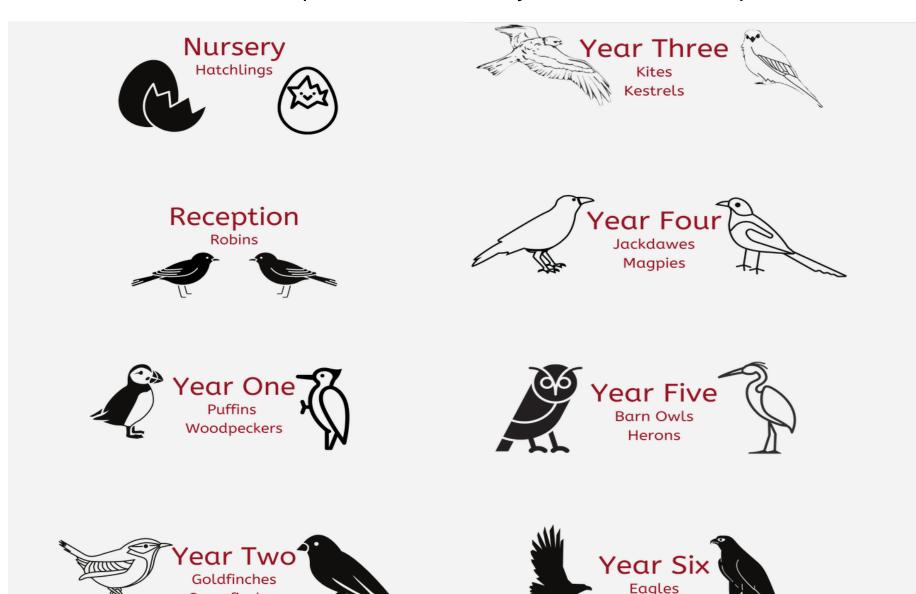
Children have been working towards our CAW Quality of RESEPECT this week so I'm excited to award certificates on Monday morning.


Reading Raffle 4!




