

Come and join us at WASP!


WASP is our extended after school provision to help families with their childcare needs. Children do lots of fun activities with our dedicated team of trained playworkers.

WASP is open from 3.15pm to 6.00pm during term time and places can be booked via the Arbor App up until midnight of the day before.

If you need to book a space on the same day, please call the WASP mobile to check availability and book – tel: 07394 140550

Sessions are charged at £10 per day with a reduced rate for the first sibling of £7 and £5 for the second sibling. We are also able to accept payment via the Tax-Free Childcare scheme and can provide documents to enable costs to be claimed back via Universal Credit for those families that are eligible.

Jaiyah Saelua *American Samoan footballer*

American Samoa in the South



Jaiyah Saelua (full name Jaiyah Tauasuesimeamativa Saelua) is an American Samoan football player who currently plays for Ilaoa and To'omata SC and formerly the American Samoa national team. She is known as the first transgender woman to play in a FIFA World Cup Qualifier. Jaiyah Saelua showed true resilience throughout her lifetime and her footballing career, to break down barriers and stigma connected to gender within football.

Ke Huy Quan (pronounced 'Kee Hoo-I Kwan')

Academy Award winning actor

Born in Viet Nam in 1971, Ke Huy Quan emigrated to the USA with his family after the Viet Nam war ended in 1975. He loved acting and became famous for playing Short Round in *Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom* (when he was 13) and Richard 'Data' Wang in *The Goonies* (when he was 14). He continued to show EFFORT throughout his acting and directing career, and was awarded the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor in the surreal film *Everything Everywhere All At Once*.



Tax-Free Childcare for WASP

We are delighted to be able to confirm that our WASP after school club is now registered to accept payments via the Tax-Free Childcare scheme.

To check if you're eligible and sign up for the scheme please use the link below -

Tax-Free Childcare - GOV.UK

If you would like to make payment using this scheme, please advise the office of the payment reference from your account for each child you wish to book into WASP.

PLEASE NOTE - you must make payments for each of your children individually and not send one lump sum for multiple children.

When you opt to pay the school through your Tax-Free Childcare Account, it is sent to the school's bank account. We will then need to upload the funds to your Arbor account to enable you to book the place for your child at WASP.

As a minimum, we will upload the payments weekly on a Tuesday. You will then be able to book the days that you require via Arbor as normal. We will be unable to credit your Arbor account until the funds are showing on the school's bank account.

This is a new process for us, so we thank you for your patience whilst we embed this.

Dyslexia Awareness Week 2024



It's <u>Dyslexia Awareness Week 2024</u>! This year's theme is **"What's Your Story?"** It has three key messages:

- Every story is different showcasing the diversity of the dyslexic community and highlighting that everyone's experience of dyslexia is unique. 10% of the population are dyslexic that's over 6.7 million stories to tell.
- A strong opening sets the scene raising awareness of the importance of early identification and intervention to ensure that every person with dyslexia can flourish.
- It's never too late to change your story highlighting how the British Dyslexia Association (BDA) can provide support and signposting to help dyslexic people begin a new chapter.
