Anti-Racist Education Strategy



Anti-Racist / Racial Literacy Workshop Invite for All Parent/Carers

Our aim is for all our families to be actively engaged in teaching their children about being anti-racist citizens as well as all being secure in their own racial literacy. Please make the time to come and reflect together on how this can best be done.

When: Tuesday 29th April 2025. 9.15am – 11.30am. Please come after school drop off.

Workshop provided by: Brighton and Hove Council Anti-Racist Education Strategy Team

Brief Outline of Workshop:

What is anti-racism and what does it mean to be an anti-racist school?

Schools should be places that are safe and welcoming for all students and staff. This session will give parents and carers an insight into the training that school staff receive as well as helping you to develop your own understanding on how to be anti-racist and developing your own racial literacy. The aim is that those attending will then use this information to further support their own child's racial literacy at home as families work to ensure that their children grows up to be an anti-racist member of society. This workshop will help support those attending to develop their confidence when identifying any form of racism (including microaggressions) and aims to help attendees to feel better equipped and skilled when talking to their children about this in a way that is effective and has lasting impact.



Come and join us at WASP!


WASP is our extended after school provision to help families with their childcare needs. Children do lots of fun activities with our dedicated team of trained playworkers.

WASP is open from 3.15pm to 6.00pm during term time and places can be booked via the Arbor App up until midnight of the day before.

If you need to book a space on the same day, please call the WASP mobile to check availability and book – tel: 07394 140550

Sessions are charged at £10 per day with a reduced rate for the first sibling of £7 and £5 for the second sibling. We are also able to accept payment via the Tax-Free Childcare scheme and can provide documents to enable costs to be claimed back via Universal Credit for those families that are eligible.

Maya Angelou was an American writer, poet, and performer. She displayed collaboration as a young woman when she sang in an international opera tour. Maya then worked collaboratively with civil rights leaders such as Malcom X and Martin Luther King Jr, to bring more equality to America. As a child she found strength in reading and read every book in her library! Angelou published over 30 titles in her life, including poetry collections, children's books, and 7 autobiographies. In 2011 President Barack Obama awarded Angelou the Presidential Medal of Freedom which is the country's highest nonmilitary honour.



Tax-Free Childcare for WASP

We are delighted to be able to confirm that our WASP after school club is now registered to accept payments via the Tax-Free Childcare scheme.

To check if you're eligible and sign up for the scheme please use the link below -

Tax-Free Childcare - GOV.UK

If you would like to make payment using this scheme, please advise the office of the payment reference from your account for each child you wish to book into WASP.

PLEASE NOTE - you must make payments for each of your children individually and not send one lump sum for multiple children.

When you opt to pay the school through your Tax-Free Childcare Account, it is sent to the school's bank account. We will then need to upload the funds to your Arbor account to enable you to book the place for your child at WASP.

As a minimum, we will upload the payments weekly on a Tuesday. You will then be able to book the days that you require via Arbor as normal. We will be unable to credit your Arbor account until the funds are showing on the school's bank account.

This is a new process for us, so we thank you for your patience whilst we embed this.
