
Reading Raffle 3

The Greatest Scientist

Albert Einstein (1879-1955)

Albert Einstein was a brilliant scientist who changed the way people viewed the universe!

Einstein was born in Ulm, Germany in 1879 and grew up in Munich. He dropped out of school and was rejected from several universities. Eventually, he got into the Swiss Polytechnic in Zurich where he studied to be a teacher. After failing to find a teaching job, he found work in an office checking out other people's inventions. But in his spare time he was putting together some brilliant scientific ideas. When people realised how clever he was, he became a professor four times and was given an honorary degrees from many universities including Oxford and Cambridge, Manchester and London. He won the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1921 for showing that light was not just made up of waves, it could also be thought of as individual packets of light or photons.



Robert Burns was a poet and lyricist (writer of words to music) from Ayrshire in Scotland. He is celebrated as one of the most famous Scottish people of all time. There are many statues of him in Scotland and several other countries. There is even a crater on Mars named after him! His writings have inspired people for centuries and he is held with a huge amount of RESPECT across the world. Burns died at the age of 37 from a heart condition. Burns Night is celebrated each year around 25th January (Robert's birthday), when Scottish families get together for traditional meal (often including haggis!).



Tax-Free Childcare for WASP

We are delighted to be able to confirm that our WASP after school club is now registered to accept payments via the Tax-Free Childcare scheme.

To check if you're eligible and sign up for the scheme please use the link below -

Tax-Free Childcare - GOV.UK

If you would like to make payment using this scheme, please advise the office of the payment reference from your account for each child you wish to book into WASP.

PLEASE NOTE - you must make payments for each of your children individually and not send one lump sum for multiple children.

When you opt to pay the school through your Tax-Free Childcare Account, it is sent to the school's bank account. We will then need to upload the funds to your Arbor account to enable you to book the place for your child at WASP.

As a minimum, we will upload the payments weekly on a Tuesday. You will then be able to book the days that you require via Arbor as normal. We will be unable to credit your Arbor account until the funds are showing on the school's bank account.

This is a new process for us, so we thank you for your patience whilst we embed this.

It's <u>Dyslexia Awareness Week 2024</u>! This year's theme is **"What's Your Story?"** It has three key messages:

- Every story is different showcasing the diversity of the dyslexic community and highlighting that everyone's experience of dyslexia is unique. 10% of the population are dyslexic that's over 6.7 million stories to tell.
- A strong opening sets the scene raising awareness of the importance of early identification and intervention to ensure that every person with dyslexia can flourish.
- It's never too late to change your story highlighting how the British Dyslexia Association (BDA) can provide support and signposting to help dyslexic people begin a new chapter.
